
Fortunately, a few commentators really do "get it". They deeply understand envy and its profound effects on human action.

They live lives of immense guilt over receiving tons of money for pretending to be real people.



Envy is ENVY, regardless of who spews it.


It's a component and characteristic of a person's character, persona, and psyche. **It is by definition**, *ad hominem*.

SOME OF MY OWN THOUGHTS

Even if you're non-religious, agnostic, atheist, or non-theist, it's **not** difficult to imagine (or even conclude) that —

Not ever.




AT THE CORE

Central to envy is <u>social comparison</u>. When a person of envy compares abilities, achievements, or possessions with another — and comes away with a sense of utter inadequacy — it brings forth a whole universe of negative and self-destructive emotions. To name but a few:

anger
anguish
anxiety
hate
doubt
fear
spite
resentment

From plentiful evidence and plain common sense, one may easily and confidently conclude:



Envy is a net subtraction from the sum of human existence.

What About Jealousy?

Jealousy is often confused with envy, but it's slightly different.

Jealousy is an emotion experienced when a person is threatened by the loss of an important *relationship* (still a likely value) with another person — not by the resentment of anyone having "stuff".

While jealousy can lead to hard-core envy, it is the lesser evil.

The murders committed by **O.J. Simpson** may well have been motivated by jealousy and then deteriorated into the worst kind of envy. He murdered two people just so "no one else could have Nicole".

Then, a mindless jury refused to find him guilty because they, as racists, "didn't want whitey-justice" to prevail.

They — the jury — refused to live in objective reality.

The jurors preferred to lead their lives in psychological denial, ignorance, and stupidity — until they die.

Talk about self-destruction! Fortunately for the scales of justice, the civil trial found him guilty. He earned that guilt.

Think about it - O.J. Simpson murdered two people just so no other human could have a relationship with his former wife.

He knew his relationship with Nicole was over.

And, as far as he's concerned, it's irrelevant that he also murdered Mr. Goldberg; a totally innocent man who had the sad misfortune of being in the wrong place at the wrong time.

If there's a Hell, may this fat sociopath — and all murderers — forever be a resident; naked, smoldering, and sizzling in an infinite kettle of sulfuric acid.

RESEARCH

In researching envy, I discovered an extremely interesting study by two professors that shocked and stunned me to the core.

It has to do with the question of whether or not people will give up their own treasure just to exercise envy. <u>They certainly will</u>.

The astoundingly high percentage of people who will sacrifice in this way simply boggles the mind.

Abstract

This paper studies utility interdependence in the laboratory. We design an experiment where subjects can reduce ("burn") other subjects' money. Those who burn the money of others have to give up some of their own cash to do so.

Despite this cost and contrary to the assumptions of economics textbooks, the majority of our subjects chose to destroy at least part of others' money holdings.

We vary experimentally the amount that subjects have to pay to reduce other people's cash. The implied price elasticity of burning is calculated; it is mostly less than unity. There is a strong correlation between wealth, or rank, and the amounts by which subjects are burnt.

In making their decisions, many burners, especially disadvantaged ones, seem to care about whether another person 'deserves' the money he has. Desert is not simply a matter of relative payoff.

Now, I guessed the percentage of people who would actually sacrifice their own treasure — and stuff — would be at most 10% - 15%.

"C'mon, it's one thing to hate someone as an envy-twit, but to actually spend one's own booty doing it?"

Folks, hang on to your sanity because this study shows the percentage of envious people willing to do just that will freezedry you where you sit.

The percentage is almost 66% — nearly two thirds!

That percentage can only be described as HUGE!

That's right; nearly two thirds of all enviers you encounter are willing to "whack you good" —

even if it drains their personal swamp.


As this information wends its way about your synapses; the staggering implications and ramifications will likely make your knees do a Knock & Wobbly.

Let your mind soar. Think how drastically this may effect your world, your work, and your relationships.

I suggest these human predilections carry profound implications all the way from one-to-one relationships to interactions between nations and everywhere in between.

IN THE BEGINNING WAS ENVY



Drop-kicking ourselves back 50,000 years, let's learn a little more about how it all started.

Back when man lived in caves and congregated in tribes numbering few to "many" individuals.

Early Man lived as hunters and gatherers. They coalesced into families and tribes which means they had "**social proximity**".

When an individual was deemed to have too many resources, others would seek to damage the overachiever by taking the resources, inflicting injury, or at least, shun the person.

This tended to keep the order of the group intact and the mating opportunities in balance.

Limiting the success of an individual was merited <u>when</u>
<u>resources were scarce</u> because more equitable distribution
begat [a little Bible Talk] substantially enhanced survivability of
the entire family or tribe.



This was a world of **superstition** and belief in the **supernatural**. Way before the existence of <u>efficient processes</u>, <u>philosophy</u>, <u>technology</u>, and <u>science</u> — especially philosophy and science.

This epoch was the genesis of altruism and its collectivist and Socialist spawn. But that's a story for another time.

OK, you say, what about today?

Indeed, it's a very long way from the epoch of Early Man to the 21st century. A large book could be written about how envy was a fellow traveler that effected everything.

- 4. <u>Take no prisoners</u>. Don't give a millimeter. Never stop throwing their putrid envy right back in their face.




Again, envy is envy no matter the homo sapiens disgorging it.

After all, I want everyone to sweat salt in the summer and freeze-dry their hides in the winter."


"Above all, I can't stand the fact that the common cold will be eliminated.

I love to suffer a snotty nose and want everyone to join me in my 'stuffed-up node' deliriums!"


This list could go on forever.

CONCLUSION

Now, if you're like most people, envy is something you probably never think or dream about in a profound way.

Especially recognizing it as the cause of so much discomfort in your life. Yet, you encounter envy every day.

What characteristics do the envious display for all the world to see? What are the most obvious and visible?

• The most notorious and obvious insignia is hypocrisy.

Being **in**consistent is a badge of honor for enviers. It seems to be the most reliable and best alert/warning system for recognizing those infected with envy.

• Another is the <u>penchant for "magical thinking"</u>. Thinking disconnected from reality. They are clueless as to philosophy's Law of Identity. <u>The fact that "A" is "A"</u>.

- <u>Psychological denial</u> lives quite large in their persona as well. They wallow in it. Stew in it. Pee in it.
- <u>Psychological Projection</u> is too often their modus operandi. They'll dump their deepest-held personality defects onto targets of their envy. The evil things they accuse one of doing, or being, are often the very characteristics that exist at the center of their own persona.

Watch for this "Projection Syndrome". You'll be surprised at how often it goes on parade.

- <u>Pessimism</u> is their creed and mind set. To them a glass is always at least 80% empty --- even when it's objectively brim-full. Look for their predominate (and automatic) negative response to the good.
- <u>Parasitical</u>. There are two classes of people in the world: Producers and Parasites. Being a moral producer is a Good. Intentionally being a moral parasite is not.

[Now don't get upset with the messenger; I'm **not** talking about those who are physically or mentally incapable through no fault of their own.]

• **LOW SELF-ESTEEM.** It's at the very core.

Enviers are utterly thunderstruck when confronted with their inconsistencies and pitifully **low self-esteem**.

People with wonderfully high self-esteem rarely, if ever, whirl into a fit of envy. They don't need to — they tend to admire, appreciate, and applaud the "stuff" of others.

They honor themselves as rational Sovereign Individuals. They celebrate the good for being the good. They respect Heroic Man.

FINAL WORDS ABOUT ENVY

<u>It's insidious, malicious and diabolical</u>. It's rarely, if ever, beneficial as it flourishes within — and permeates through — all societies and cultures while tending to cluster in peer groups or classes.

Indeed, envy can be drop-dead detrimental to your well being.

Through what prism do you now see the world?


